ear Brothers,


These past weeks have been filled with blessings for our council!



FROM THE LIFE DIRECTOR

October is Respect Life Month celebrated by the Catholic Church in the United States with October 5th being Respect Life Sunday. The USCCB provides resources for Catholics to engage in activities and prayer so as to fully understand the value of every human life from conception to natural death. An online Novena for Life will begin on October 22nd. Details

of resources and other information are available on the USCCB website.

October is also the month of the Rosary. The Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is on October 7th and commemorates a naval victory in 1571 that prevented an Islamic invasion of Europe. The faithful prayed the Holy Rosary and the devotion is credited for the victory.

The JMJ Baby Bottle campaign will begin on October 5th. The St. James Respect Life Ministry will be spearheading the campaign in the parish this year with assistance from our council.

The 40 Days for Life campaign began on September 24th and runs to November 2nd in 671 cities around the world. There are 9 vigil sites in Florida with 3 in the Orlando area. Location details can be found on the Florida 40 Days for Life website

The JMJ annual fundraising gala was held on September 20th with over 700 attendees. The goal was to raise \$420,000. The funding is crucial for the continued operation of 3 facilities in the area.

September 11, 2025: The First Circuit Court of Appeals ruled that the "The July 21, 2025 preliminary injunction and the July 28, 2025 preliminary injunction are hereby stayed pending disposition of the respective appeals" allowing Planned Parenthood to be defunded. The defunding affects abortion clinics that received \$800,000 in Medicaid funds in 2023 and is in effect for one year.

Texas and Florida have asked to join the lawsuit challenging the FDA's decision to loosen the restrictions on the abortion drug mifepristone. The lawsuit was originally filed by Missouri, Kansas and Idaho. The FDA's action made it easy to receive the drug through mail order delivery. These deliveries are occurring even in states with total abortion bans resulting in criminal charges filed by those states to the prescribing physicians. It is estimated that of all abortions today are chemically induced using mifepristone.



- Sources of member nominations can come from parish priests, council members, ministry leaders with active Knights serving their ministry, etc. These sources can also be used to get additional background information on their church, community, or ministry activities.
- Provide justification for your nomination when submitting.

Family of the Month Factors to consider in their search for a 'Family of the Month':

☐ Has the family made significant contributions to the Church, community and/or council?
☐ Is the family tight knit?
☐ Does the family spend quality time together?
☐ Does the family attend weekly Mass together?
☐ Does the family pray together outside of Mass?
☐ Does the family serve as a model of Catholic family values?
☐ The "Family of the Month" nominated family doesn't need to be a "super family". The nominated family
should be a family that lives traditional Christian family values and deserves recognition for doing so.

☐ It is not required that the catholic gentlemen be a Knight to be eligible for the Family of the Month.

Nomination Sources

- Nominations can be made from any council member who knows of council member families or parish families that support family life.
- Sources of nominations can come from parish priests, neighbors, council members, ministry leaders, etc. They can be used to get recommendations, references and evaluations concerning council families. They can also speak directly to the families being considered.
- Provide justification for your nomination when submitting.






SUPREME CHAPLAIN'S MONTHLY CHALLENGE

The parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector relates back to our August monthly challenge about humility. The Pharisee exalts himself before God, extolling his superiority and keeping of the law. Meanwhile, the tax collector prays with humility, seeking mercy for his sins. Our culture stresses the im-

portance of "self-esteem," but we must also remember that all of us are sinners in need of God's mercy. We should never approach God in a spirit of pride, but always humbly on our knees — confident of his loving mercy.

CHALLENGE BY SUPREME CHAPLAIN ARCHBISHOP WILLIAM E. LORI:

This month, the month dedicated to the holy rosary, I challenge you to pray five decades of the rosary daily, asking God for humility and mercy.

QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION:

Have there been times in your life when you pridefully compared yourself to others, like the Pharisee in this parable? Do you perform a regular and careful examination of conscience so as to remain humbly aware of your sinfulness? What other steps can you take to become more like the tax collector in this parable?

s we move into the autumn season, the Church invites us to turn our hearts toward eternity and to pray for the repose of the souls of our loved ones. November, in particular, is a month dedicated to prayer for the dead — beginning with All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day — and is a fitting time for us as Knights to honor those who have gone before us.

Scripture reminds us: "It is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins."

2 Maccabees 12:46

The **Remembering Our Faithful Departed** program calls councils to unite parish and family members in prayer for the deceased — brother Knights, family members, and the whole parish community. By commemorating the departed, we console those who grieve, strengthen the bonds of faith, and offer spiritual aid to the souls in purgatory.

Saint John Chrysostom encourages us: "Let us help and commemorate them. If Job's sons were purified by their father's sacrifice, why would we doubt that our offerings for the dead bring them some consolation?"

PRACTICAL WAYS TO PARTICIPATE

- Create a Prayer Space: Set up a small ofrenda (altar) or memorial table at home or in the parish with photos, candles, and holy cards as a call to prayer.
- Offer Holy Mass: Request a Mass intention for your loved ones and attend together as a family or council.
- Pray Together: Organize a memorial Rosary, pray the 100 Requiem Prayer, or gather as a council for evening prayer for the dead.
- Visit Cemeteries: Spend time at the graves of family members and parishioners, praying and teaching younger generations the importance of remembering the dead.

As Knights, we are called to lead our families and parish in these works of mercy. This season, may our prayers console the grieving, strengthen our parish community, and hasten the day when our faithful departed share fully in the joy of heaven.

SPIRITUAL CARE MINISTERS NEEDED


There is an urgent need for **Catholic Spiritual Care Ministers** at Orlando Regional Medical Center (ORMC). Deacons, men in formation, and their wives (if trained as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion) are invited to serve.

This ministry offers compassionate presence, prayer, and sacramental coordination for patients and families in a 1,700-bed hospital. Deacons are especially suited to provide hope, calm, and witness to Christ in moments of suffering. Volunteers help arrange for Anointing of the Sick and Reconciliation, partnering with priests serving at ORMC.







Ultrasound Initiative & Helping Life Fund: Building a Culture of Life

he Knights of Columbus are committed to defending life. Two key programs in Florida— the Ultrasound Initiative and the Helping Life Fund—are making a powerful difference for mothers and babies across our state.

Ultrasound Initiative

Since 2009, Knights have helped place over 1,900 ultrasound machines, valued at \$91 million, in pro-life clinics and pregnancy centers—135 of those here in Florida. Local councils fund half the cost; the Supreme Council covers the rest. For fully funded mobile units, Supreme may cover 100% of the ultrasound machine cost.

Ultrasound machines are life-saving tools. Up to 80% of abortion-minded women choose life after viewing an image of their unborn child.

Ask your local pregnancy center:

Do they need a new, or replacement machine?

Are they opening a new location?

Would a mobile unit help serve more women?





FROM THE WORTHY LECTURER

It's football season, a time when many people make pilgrimages of hope to their favorite stadiums to cheer on their favorite teams, hoping for a win. If you find yourself on the road this Fall, remember that there's another type of Pilgrimage of Hope you can make, one that's better for you and your soul than even the best tailgate party ... one where everyone's a winner.

It's a Jubilee Year, a year when we're reminded, in the words of Pope Francis, "that the Christian life is a journey." We are called to be Pilgrims of Hope. We are called to make a pilgrimage "in which the Grace of God precedes and accompanies his people as they press forward firm in faith, active in charity and steadfast in hope." (*Spes non confudit.*)



We may earn plenary indulgences by making pious visits to designated pilgrimage sites, performing works of mercy and penance, or participating in spiritual exercises or formation activities on the documents of the Second Vatican Council or the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*. For those unable to travel, they may earn a plenary indulgence if, united in spirit with the faithful, they recite the Our Father, the Profession of Faith, and other prayers in conformity with the objectives of the Holy Year, offering up their sufferings or the hardships of their lives.

To obtain a plenary indulgence, the following conditions must be fulfilled: detachment from all sin, even venial sin; sacramental confession within 20 days of the indulgenced act; Holy Communion (separately for each indulgence); Prayers for the Pope's intentions, such as an Our Father and Hail Mary. Only one plenary indulgence may be earned each day; however, a second plenary indulgence may be earned for a soul in purgatory.



Knights of Columbus: A Legacy of Charity and Faith

The Knights of Columbus were founded in 1882 by Father Michael J. McGivney with a mission of charity. The Order quickly expanded beyond the United States, and during World War I, they established welcoming huts offering free services to all. In the 1920s, the Knights advocated for anti-defamation and religious freedom. They renewed their commitment to volunteer service during the Great Depression and later focused on combating communism and fascism post-World War II. In the 1950s, they played a key role in adding "under God" to the U.S. Pledge of Allegiance. The Knights continued to support ecclesial reform and strengthen ties with the Vatican, especially during John Paul II's pontificate.

Into the new millennium, they maintained their charitable work, aiding displaced Christians in the 2010s. The beatification of Father McGivney in 2020 marked a new chapter, with the Order launching initiatives to deepen faith and fraternity. The Knights' history is a testament to their enduring dedication to charity and service.

God, our Father, protector of the poor and defender of the widow and orphan, you called your priest, Father Michael J. McGivney, to be an apostle of Christian family life and to lead the young to the generous service of their neighbor. 


