

# A Light Brightly Visible by Bishop Noonan



My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

God tells us that our profession of faith to follow Him is not easy; that we are to give up our possessions to know, love and serve Him. He says not to treasure but keep our focus on God alone. The psalmist prays that not our will, but God's will be done that the gracious care of the Lord be ours so that He alone prospers the work of our hands. If we all lived for God, 24-7-365, imagine the beauty of the earth for God's glory! God, the Creator of all life, gave us one another that we might uphold His tender care by how we love one another. We are asked to pay attention, not to things, but to one another. We are asked to strive for docility to the Word of God and to flourish His gift of life upon one another. Like the psalmist, we pray for intellectual humility because we must accept that our understanding of the world has limits. Our knowledge cannot compare to the limitless knowledge of God. In this we also seek humility when looking upon others and their actions truly know their situations and God asks us to serve, not judge. We pray that we will be filled with God's wisdom as we come to know God, for then His wisdom within us abounds and we are led to Him. St. Paul tells us that no matter the class of an individual, he or she is to be treated as a person of dignity through, with and in God. Rather than look down upon those with less economic or intellectual ability or people with whom we supervise, we are to see each one as a child of God. That designation gives the "lowly" a status of God's glory for all are created in God's perfection. In our daily living, we often take note of those around us who excel in bringing forth God's love, no matter the circumstance. There are many who serve as examples for us, from members of our families to clergy and religious, friends, prophets, and saints. Two individuals who set the measure of God were canonized saints Sept. 7, Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati and Blessed Carlo Acutis. The two Italian laymen will be the first saints proclaimed by Pope Leo XIV. Pope Leo XIV also confirmed that seven other Blesseds will be canonized Oct. 19, World Mission Sunday. The group includes men and women from five countries, among them martyrs, founders of religious congregations and laypeople recognized for their heroic virtue and service. As you arise each day, pray how you might serve God's people, in every moment that your day makes straight a path to holiness. Let us pray for one another that God prospers the work of our hands so that all the people will joyfully come to know, love, and serve God!

#### Who is Father Holmes?

Father William J. Holmes was born on **April 20, 1902, in Milford, County Cork, Ireland**, one of six children of Denis and Mrs. Holmes. From an early age, he was drawn to faith and education, studying in both Irish and American seminaries. His academic journey took him through **St. Coleman's College (Fermoy)**, **All Hallows (Dublin)**, **St. Patrick's College (Carlow)**, and finally **Kenrick Seminary in St. Louis, Missouri**.

In May 1929, Father Holmes joined the Congregation of the Priests of the Sacred Heart, committing himself to a missionary life. On April 3, 1932, he was ordained at Sacred Heart Monastery in Hales Corners, Wisconsin, by Archbishop Samuel Stritch. His first assignment was in Sault Ste. Marie, Illinois, before embarking on mission work among the Sioux Indians of the Cheyenne Reservation in South Dakota, where he served from 1934 to 1939. Later, he taught at the Divine Heart College in Donaldson, Indiana, until 1942.

That same year, Father Holmes came to Florida and began his long ministry within the **Diocese of St. Augustine**, which later became part of the Orlando Diocese. On **March 24, 1952**, he was incardinated as a diocesan priest. Over the years, he served at many parishes across Florida, including **St. Patrick's in Miami Beach**, **St. James in Orlando**, **St. Francis Xavier in Fort Myers**, **Sts. Peter and Paul in Miami**, **St. Margaret in Clewiston**, **Epiphany in South Miami**, and the **Cathedral in St. Augustine**.

Father Holmes' leadership as pastor was especially remembered at Holy Redeemer Church in Kissimmee (1957–1962), St. Michael's in Fernandina Beach (1962–1964), and St. Thomas Aquinas in St. Cloud (1964–1968), where he also served as the first chaplain of St. Cloud Hospital when it opened. His ministry was marked by dedication, humility, and a pioneering spirit that helped lay the foundations of the Catholic Church in central Florida.

After retiring on **October 1, 1968**, Father Holmes remained active in Orlando, remembered by his fellow priests as loyal, hardworking, and always ready to serve. In **November 1968**, he was honored on "Father Holmes' Day," a diocesan tribute celebrating his life of mission and service.

Father William J. Holmes passed away on **January 13, 1982, in Orlando** at the age of 79. His funeral was held at **St. Thomas Aquinas Church in St. Cloud** on **January 16, 1982**, and he was laid to rest in **Osceola Memorial Gardens, Kissimmee**.

Father Holmes' life was one of faith, service, and steadfast devotion to God's people. Through his missionary zeal and parish ministry, he became a cornerstone of the Catholic presence in Florida, remembered with deep gratitude by those he served.
