From the Deacon's Bench

September Labor day.

Greeting brothers as we begin the Month of October.

And with it, Oktoberfest. For trivia's sake... The first Oktoberfest was held on 12 October 1810.

Crown Prince Ludwig of Bavaria married Princess Therese of Saxe-Hildburghausen. Munich officials invited the public to celebrate on fields outside the city walls. The site was named Theresienwiese ("Therese's Meadow") the following year and is still called Wiesn. While that is nice to know, more important for the month of October is the Memorials of 2 doctors of the Church, the Guardian Angels and that of the Deacon Saint Francis. As of 2025, there are thirty-eight Doctors of the Church. Of those the four women who have

been declared Doctors of the Church are:

St. Hildegard of Bingen:17 September
They are recognized for their significant
contributions to theology and spirituality within
the Catholic Church.

Saint Thérèse of Lisieux, Saint of the Child Jesus, and the Holy Face, was a French Discalced Carmelite, who died at the age of 24. She is popularly known in English as the Little Flower of Jesus, or simply the Little Flower, and in French as la petite Thérèse.

In her spiritual memoir, "The Story of a Soul", she explains her theology of the "Little Way". She was beatified and canonized by Pope Pius XI, who completed the process just 28 years after her death. In 1997, Pope John Paul II declared her a Doctor of the Church. The Basilica of Lisieux is the second most popular place of pilgrimage in France after Lourdes.

Saint Teresa of Avila also called Saint

Teresa of Jesus,, 15 October.

Saint Teresa of Ávila was a Spanish Carmelite nun and mystic born in 1515, known for her profound spiritual writings and reforms of the Carmelite Order. She is celebrated for her contributions to Christian mysticism and was canonized in 1622, later becoming the first female Doctor of the Church in 1970. Her books "The Interior Castle" and "The Way of Perfection";

are prominent works on Christian mysticism and Christian meditation practice. "The Interior Castle", written as a spiritual guide for her Carmelite sisters, uses the illustration of seven mansions within the castle of the soul to describe the different states one's soul can be in during life.

Saint Francis of Assisi: **4 October**So much has been written about the Saintly
Deacon, but what many may not know is that
tradition holds that during Saint Dominic's
second visit to Rome, in 1216, he met Francis of
Assisi.

Both were negotiating with the Holy See through their mutual patron, Cardinal Ugolino, later Pope Gregory IX, to obtain papal confirmation of their respective orders—The Order of Preachers, Saint Dominic's and The Order of Friars Minor, Saint Francis's. I mention these Doctor's because their writings are readily available and well worth reading. The Church is much richer by the life and witness of Saint Francis and Saint Dominic for reflection and spiritual growth.

Our Guardian Angels, **2 October**Tradition holds, a Guardian Angel is assigned to each at birth, linked to anyone who lives within God's grace. The Fathers of the Church, like Tertullian, Saint Augustine, Saint Ambrose, Saint John Chrysostom, Saint Jerome and Saint Gregory of Nyssa, maintained that a guardian angel existed for each person, and although there was not yet a dogmatic formulation concerning this figure, during the Council of Trent (1545 – 1563) it was stated that every human being had their own angel. From the seventeenth century onwards, the spread of popular devotion increased and Pope Paul V added the festival of guardian angels to the calendar, **2 October.**

So I leave you with this pray to **your** Angel:
Angel of God, my guardian dear,
to whom God's love commits me here,
ever this day (night) be at my side,
to light and guard,
to rule and guide. **Amen.**



Supreme Chaplain's Challenge by Archbishop William E. Lori

"But the tax collector stood off at a distance and would not even raise his eyes to heaven but beat his breast and prayed, 'O God, be merciful to me a sinner." (Gospel for Oct. 26, Lk 18:13)

The parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector relates back to our August monthly challenge about humility. The Pharisee exalts himself before God, extolling his superiority and keeping of the law. Meanwhile, the tax collector prays with humility, seeking mercy for his sins. Our culture stresses the importance of "self-esteem," but we must also remember that all of us are sinners in need of God's mercy. We should never approach God in a spirit of pride, but always humbly on our knees — confident of his loving mercy.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, the month dedicated to the holy rosary, I challenge you to pray five decades of the rosary daily, asking God for humility and mercy.

Questions for Reflection:

Have there been times in your life when you pridefully compared yourself to others, like the Pharisee in this parable? Do you perform a regular and careful examination of conscience so as to remain humbly aware of your sinfulness? What other steps can you take to become more like the tax collector in this parable?
