



Advent: A Season of Hope, Preparation, and Brotherhood

Advent is not simply a countdown to Christmas—it is a sacred time of expectation and preparation. The Church calls us to ready our hearts for the coming of Christ: in the celebration of His birth and in anticipation of His return in glory. The purple candles of the Advent wreath remind us of penance and preparation, while the rose candle speaks of joy amidst waiting. This season is rich with meaning: hope, peace, joy, and love—virtues that resonate deeply with our Catholic faith and the mission of the Knights of Columbus.

Advent is a season of hope. In a world often clouded by uncertainty, hope anchors us in the promise of Emmanuel—"God with us." As Knights, we are called to be bearers of that hope, living out our principles of charity, unity, and fraternity. Charity during Advent means more than giving gifts; it means giving of ourselves—our time, attention, and compassion—to those who need it most. Unity reminds us that we are stronger together, especially when we gather as a parish family to pray, serve, and celebrate. Fraternity calls us to support one another in faith, encouraging each other to grow closer to Christ during this holy season.


Advent often competes with the busyness of the world. Shopping lists, parties, and endless tasks can easily overshadow the spiritual preparation we are called to embrace. How do we keep Advent holy amid the noise? The answer lies in intentionality. Advent is not about doing more; it's about doing what matters most—creating space for Christ in our hearts and homes.

Here is a challenge for every Knight this Advent: Choose one concrete way to slow down and prepare spiritually in one of these many ways. Firstly, commit to daily prayer—even just five minutes of quiet reflection with Scripture or the Advent readings. Secondly, attend an extra Mass during the week or participate in the parish Advent mission or penance service. Or, thirdly, light the Advent wreath at home and pray with your family.

I also invite and challenge you to live out charity in a tangible way. Support the parish Giving Tree, help sort the toys/gifts and/or help pack the truck as we take those much needed gifts to Immokalee. Or maybe you could visit someone who is lonely, or volunteer at a local food pantry, or get some shopping for a shut-in neighbor. These acts of service reflect the heart of Advent and the values of the Knights of Columbus. When we serve others, we prepare a manger in our hearts for Christ to dwell.

Advent is a season of joy—not the fleeting joy of material things, but the deep joy that comes from knowing Christ is near. As Knights, let us be witnesses of that joy in our families, parish, and community. Let our words and actions proclaim the hope of the Gospel, even in the simplest ways.

Brothers, Advent is short—just four weeks—but its impact can be eternal if we embrace it fully. If we get in to the routine of coming to mass an extra time a week, or if we spend at least five minutes in prayer, or visit that shut-in neighbor during Advent that can become a good habit that we keep year round! Let us journey together, as men of faith and action, preparing the way of the Lord. May this Advent be a time of renewal for each of us, and may we enter Christmas with hearts ready to receive the greatest gift of all: Jesus Christ.

#### <u>Discover "The ONE" – A Parish Mission with Greg Wasinski</u>





A Grand Knight from a council in Fredericksburg, Texas, heard about Josh and sent him a first class relic of Fr. Michael McGivney. Josh's family launched a Novena to Fr. McGivney with that relic prior to Josh's surgery.

After the surgery Dr. Wagner sent this message to Josh's family . This is what his mother reported from Dr. Wagner:


"Dr. Wagner called us this evening..."negative margins all around the excised tumor and no evidence of spread to the lymph nodes that were biopsied. Pathology report isn't final yet but confident that after surgical recovery and physical therapy we will be moving to just surveillance scans at UK (University of Kentucky) every 3 months. Praise God"!

We are all very grateful for Josh's recovery and particularly wish to thank all of you who prayed on Josh's behalf.

Blessed Fr. Michael McGivney has been proposed for Sainthood. Usually, the Catholic Church requires a saintly candidate receive two miracles attributed to the candidate. Fr. McGivney already has one prior to this surgery. We continue to pray for Blessed Fr. McGivney in hopes for his canonization.

#### 2026 CITIZENS WITH DISABILITIES DRIVE

Brothers, our Citizens with Disabilities Drive will be here before we know it. We will be donning our bright yellow aprons and passing out Tootsie Rolls and Tootsie Pops and of course asking for donations after all the Masses at **O.L.M.C on Saturday January 31 and Sunday February 1, 2026** Our PUBLIX drive will be held on **Friday, Saturday and Sunday February 6th, 7th and 8th, 2026**. On Friday and Saturday there will be 5 - 2-hour shifts from 9:00 am until 7:00 pm. On Sunday we will have 3 – 2 hour shifts from 9:00 am until 3:00 pm. Please sign up to work a mass and a shift at Publix at our January 2026 officers and council meetings.



The "Citizens with Disabilities Drive" was started in the early 1970s and has grown to include the majority of councils in the country. It has collected and distributed more than 390 million dollars since then. Various councils hold the drive at different times throughout the year. Our council participates the weekend before and the weekend of the Superbowl.

Council 15821 has taken part in the "Tootsie Roll Drive" since our beginning. We had a rocky start not having a suitable location in "our parish" and we inadvertently infringed on the locations of councils in other parishes. Publix helped us out greatly by building the store in the plaza at the corner of U.S. 41 and Blackburn Point (Old Venice Rd.) We have used that location since then.

For many years we had to send the total collection, less the cost of the candy, to the State Council. State would take 10 % to distribute to charities at the State level and then cut checks to our selected charities and mail them to our council for distribution. Then the rules changed, and State Council cut the checks and mailed them directly to our selected charities. Then the rules changed again and now we keep all our collection. We cut the checks and distribute them to our charities. Our charities this year are Venice Special Olympics, Venice Challenger Baseball and the Autism program at St. Marthas School in Sarasota.

REMEMBER – please sign up at our meetings in January 2026 so I don't have to make a bunch of phone calls to fill the roster. Feel free to take a shift with your spouse or significant other, especially if she is a member of the Ladies Auxiliary.


