## District Deputy Message



Worthy Sirs,

The fraternal year is almost over. Only a little more than a month remains. All you councils are readily preparing for the election of officers to serve the 2022-2023 year. Elections should be completed no later than June 15. I am looking forward to working with all the elected officers who will serve their councils in the coming year.

The Florida State Convention went well. Fr. Gabriel, Bishop Verot (winner of an award), St. Joseph's, Monsignor Martin B. Power (5 awards winner) were represented. Two of the most relevant issues that were approved at the convention are the increase of state per capita to \$12 per member and the increase of travel mileage from 25 cents/mile to 30 cents/mile.

Due to the hard work and recruitment activities the district attained 135% of its new member goal. As a result, I was awarded the Circle of Excellence medallion. Only 12 districts out of 85 achieved this distinction. I am so proud of this accomplishment and want to extend my "THANKS" to Monsignor Martin B. Power council for attaining 160% of their membership goal, and St. Joseph's council for attaining 154% of their membership goal. Bishop Verot council contributed to the membership goal by attaining 89% of their goal (only two members short of 100%). I am confident they will reach their goal before the end of the year.

Memorial Day is upon us. Please take time to remember those men and women who served this country. All gave some, some gave all.
