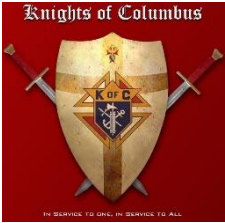

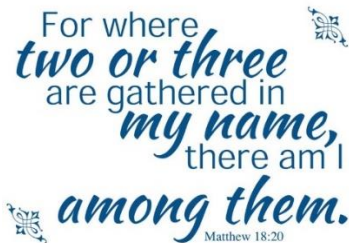
### Pro-Life Corner

#### YOU WILL NEVER KNOW TILL YOU DID IT!

To share with you this day what can happen when you do what the lord has asked you to do! Blessed is he who visits the sick. Have you ever thought of visiting the hospital brings communion to the sick and home bound? Your rewards will overcome you and may give you a lifelong memory. I went 4 times in one week and three was covered by a Nun from St Ambrose Parish and we would switch I would do three and she would do four then. I was from St. Thomas Parish

It was near 50 years ago as I was attending deaconate school in Trenton New Jersey. My family and I had plans to take a vacation to Florida. It was two weeks before Easter weekend. My ministry for 5 years was the hospital in Old Bridge, NJ I was visiting this man who was getting worse as the days went on. I visited him for a few weeks before we left for Florida the day before we left on vacation he slipped into a coma. I sat in his room and said a few prayers out loud and said to myself, I don't think I'll see you when I return. Strange but you become attached to people when they are in the hospital for any length of time.

We left for vacation and it was our first trip south for my family we did have a great time enjoying the change in the weather. I was to serve on the Easter weekend Starting on Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday.

When we returned to Old Bridge after our vacation, I went and got the Blessed Sacrament to take to the hospital from church. I went to the front desk as usual and printed out the names of the Catholic's to visit. Just as I thought would happen his name was on the list with the initials DES. For desists. I made my rounds and stopped at the desk and asked the nurse there if was true he had passed away. She said she, "yes I think so" That was Good Friday. Holy Saturday I again visited the hospital, and his name was no longer on the list. I made my rounds and in one room I visited I said a few prayers and gave the woman communion and a Jewish lady quite old said to me in a long Island accent "Fadda can you say a prayer and give me your blessing but forget with the sign of the cross!" Yes I told her and I did.

Easter Sunday after mass I went to the hospital, checked in and printed out the names usual. His name was on the list with a room number? I said to the nurse at the desk I thought he passed away. She did also, well maybe its Gods way of saying be needs a few prayers. I told her I would stop in that room at the end of my tour and say a few prayers. I walked into the room! There he was sitting up in bed drinking coffee 1 almost said 1 thought you were dead but restrained myself we talked and he said, "I came out of the coma and within a few days I was DIScharged. A mix up of abbreviations. I explained to the nurse and as I was walking out of the hospital it hit me I felt like the group of people 2,000 years ago that ran to the tomb and found He has risen! What a heart grasping feeling! Never to be forgotten.

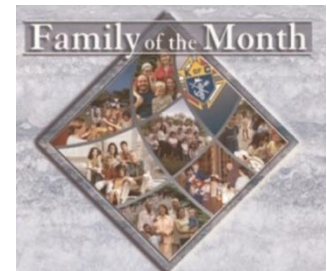
