

## Saint of the Month:

### MARK THE EVANGELIST

Mark was an Evangelist—one of the four men who wrote the Gospels found in the New Testament. Mark's Gospel was written first, and it is the shortest description of Jesus' life, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension. Mark's writings helped both Matthew and Luke to write their Gospels.

Mark was not one of the original Apostles, and he probably never knew Jesus. Instead, we believe that he was a member of the first Christian community. In his writings, St. Peter refers to Mark as his "son." Peter may have used this term to show his love for Mark, or he may have used it because he was the one who baptized Mark. It is believed that Peter was the primary source for Mark's Gospel.

Mark traveled with Sts. Paul and Barnabas to spread the Good News about Jesus. During his imprisonment in Rome, Paul mentions Mark's concern for him and writes about how helpful Mark is in the ministry of helping others to believe in Jesus (Colossians. 4:10; 2 Timothy 4:11).

Mark founded the Church in Egypt and he became bishop of Alexandria, an important center of trade and power during ancient times. He died there sometime between the years 68-74 AD as a martyr for his belief in Jesus.

Mark's Gospel is a lasting treasure for all believers. He wrote his Gospel to help people know that Jesus was the Son of God who suffered and died to save us from sin and death. When we read Mark's Gospel, we learn that to be a follower of Jesus, we, too, must be willing to make sacrifices, to "take up our cross and follow" (Mark 8:34) Jesus as he asks us to do.

The symbol for Mark is a lion with wings. That is because his Gospel begins with the story of John the Baptist, a "voice crying in the wilderness" (Mark 1:3), like the roaring of a lion. Lions are called the kings of the jungle. Mark's Gospel tells us about Jesus' royalty as God's Son, a kingship we share through our Baptism.

We celebrate Saint Mark's feast day on April 25. His life and Gospel remind us to share the Good News about Jesus with others.

During March we went back to crazy busy as our business model. Lots of events for lots of causes! This is normally one of our busiest months, but the good news is we start to wind down a little after this!

## Youth Events

**Basketball Free Throw Challenge:** As reported in the March Vessel, we qualified 3 SJV students for the State Finals. As a result of that opportunity, two of them WON the State Title in their gender/age group. Brady Henson won Boys age 10, and Isabel Santana took 1st place for Girls age 13. Congratulations to them both and to Youth Director Jim Valentine!



## Fundraisers

**Laps for Life** - we raised \$1,950 and came in 14th place in the Central Florida Drive. \$1,500 of that total was the amount we budgeted for donation. The rest was raised by the walkers: Joe & Pat Chenette, Brian & Anita Fitzgerald and Jim Valentine.



**Tootsie Roll Drive** - Led by PGK Joe Chenette (supported by his wife Pat!), we collected after all SJV Masses on the weekend of March 11-12, and outside Publix on March 18-19. This effort resulted in a new record for funds raised: \$4,261.22. This will translate into checks from the State Council for roughly \$1,900 each to the Russell Home and Morningstar School, and a State donation of about \$420 to Special Olympics. Thanks a bunch to Joe & Pat and all the Knights who worked both of the weekends, and especially to the Vogelpohl grandchildren who turned out to be our most outstanding collectors! Who said child labor was dead?? Great job to all!

**Golf Tournament Planning Meeting:** A planning meeting was held on March 25th Joe Clark's House. Six Knights attended and Joe went over the plans and 'TO-DO' list.

## Service & Social

**Lenten Soup Suppers** - Council 5958 hosted the Lenten Soup Suppers every Thursday during Lent, immediately after the Stations of the Cross. The SJV Ministries each take one Thursday to bring the soup and bread, while the Council 5958 team, led by Bob Valentine, set-up, managed the serving, cleaned up and provided crackers, butter, and the drinks EVERY week. They successfully hosted the Suppers on Feb 23rd, March 2nd, 9th, 23rd and 30th!! Great work by Bob and his team!

**24-Hours of Adoration Security** - The Church held a 24 Hours of Adoration on March 10-11. The Exposition and Adoration started Friday Morning at 9:00 AM and ended with the 8:30 AM Mass on Saturday. Faithful will be in the Chapel for the entire 24 hours. The Knights were asked to provide 'Security' on Friday the 10th from 6:30 PM until Midnight, as we have in the past. 'Security' consisted of sitting at a table near the parking lot and making sure people who are arriving and leaving did so safely. We had a great response for this and had 6+ people during some of the shift. Best response ever!

**Council Family Picnic** – Eric Rodriguez had an uncontrollable urge to grill recently and it resulted in a fabulous Council 5958 Family Picnic at Cypress Grove Park. The picnic started at noon - but all the important people from the 11:00 AM Mass weren't there until a little later. We had a GREAT turnout – 40+ people attended! Last year we took 6 months of leftover food to the Russell Home, but this year there were far fewer crumbs to take to them! We also used the occasion to say “Thank-You but not Good Bye” to Eric and Vanessa, who will be moving to Apollo Beach in late April. Eric has been a mainstay of the Council (Financial Secretary twice, Grand Knight) – and one of the best District Deputies EVER – and Vanessa has been a past Grand Lady and the heart of our Toys for Tots project each Christmas. They WILL be missed!

Sixteen Knights and their spouses had a chance to meet one of the Seminarians that the Council sponsors - Saint-Clos Papouloute. A native of Haiti, St. Clos has 3 more years until ordination, so we'll be maintaining the relationship for a while! It was great to have him join us!

### Knights of the Month – a Dual Award

**Knight of the Month #1:** Joe Chenette. Joe volunteered to be our Council Life Director this year, and that includes overall responsibility for 3 major projects: Laps for Life, Tootsie Roll Drive and Special Olympics. 
