My Fellow Knights,

As Grand Knight, I want to take this opportunity to reflect on the incredible power of prayer and its profound significance in our lives, both individually and as a brotherhood. This past month, I've been especially mindful of how prayer impacts us, and I'm continually reminded of its ability to bring comfort, healing, and hope.



Recently, I was speaking with a friend who shared a powerful testimony. She told me that one of the most impactful things she could do for a colleague battling cancer was to pray for him. And he is surviving his battles. This really resonated with me, reinforcing the idea that our prayers, even from afar, can truly make a difference in the lives of those facing immense challenges.

Even closer to home, I experienced the direct impact of prayer within our own council. My mother was recently going through a difficult time with an issue causing her a lot of pain and had to make a trip to the emergency room. When I shared this with some of our brothers, they immediately rallied together, offering fervent prayers for her recovery. Would you believe that when I later asked her if the pain was still present, she told me it had totally subsided and hadn't returned? This week, we even realized that the doctor never called in any medication for a post-visit, so we never received a call to pick it up. This has never happened before, but it seems no additional medication was even required. This experience was a vivid reminder of God's grace and the tangible results of our collective prayers.

We've also been reminded, through various events and discussions, of how prayer is a vital response to those affected by disasters. While we often feel helpless in the face of such widespread suffering, our prayers are a powerful act of solidarity and a source of strength for victims and first responders alike.

This month, I urge all of us to continue our **dedicated efforts in prayer** for those in need. Let us lift up our intentions for the sick, the suffering, those facing adversity, and all who require God's comfort and intervention. Our prayers are a true testament to our faith and our commitment to charity and unity.

The purpose of the Knights of Columbus Elijah Cup Program for Religious Vocations is to encourage families and individuals to pray for and promote vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life. We hope that those who bring the chalice home will continue to pray daily for religious vocations.

How the Program Works?


A regularly attending family or individual from the parish receives the chalice and commits to praying for vocations at home for a week. Each day the family or the individual prays for an increase in and perseverance of vocations. A binder containing prayers is provided. The following week, the chalice is passed to another family or individual who take it home and to prayer. The Lord will abundantly pour out His blessings upon those who pray for men and women in the priesthood and religious life.

Pope Leo Meets with SupremeKnight, Supreme Chaplain

As the United States celebrated Independence Day last week, Pope Leo XIV received Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly and Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William Lori of Baltimore in a private audience at the Vatican. The July 4 audience was the first meeting of the U.S.-born pope with the leader of the Knights of Columbus and the chief shepherd of the Archdiocese of Baltimore, which in 1789 became the first diocese in the United States.

During their visit, the supreme knight and supreme chaplain pledged the Order's loyalty to Pope Leo and promised ongoing prayers and support for his pontificate. They also provided the Holy Father with an overview of the Knights of Columbus, highlighting the Order's charitable activity and men's faith formation programs.

Archbishop Lori, speaking afterward with the Catholic Review in Baltimore, described the meeting as "an opportunity to present kind of a comprehensive picture of who the Knights are and what the Knights do and what some of its current initiatives are."

"He asked some good questions about aspects of the work of the Knights," the supreme chaplain continued, "particularly the *Cor* program."

Supreme Knight Kelly and Archbishop Lori presented the Holy Father with special gifts on behalf of the Order related to the patriotic occasion of the visit and Pope Leo's Augustinian background. One of the gifts was a framed archival photo of the launching of LST-286, the tank-landing ship on which the pope's father, Louis Prevost, served during the D-Day landings in Normandy, France. The gift held special significance, given the supreme knight's own service in the Navy and that Archbishop Lori's father, Francis, served on a similar tank-landing ship during World War II.

They also gave the pope two early English editions of works by St. Augustine of Hippo — his famous autobiographical *Confessions* (printed in 1660) and *Meditations* (printed in 1728), the latter comprising selections from three Augustinian works of piety: *De meditatione*, *Soliloquies* and *Enchiridion*.

Tending to the wounds of war



What does it look like to mend a country's spiritual, physical and psychological wounds from war? Some K of C-sponsored initiatives include: support groups for families who've lost a loved one, trainings on trauma-informed communication, vocational workshops, childcare centers, prosthetics for injured civilians, outreach to refugees and much more.

Protecting Ukrainian children

In times of war, children are always among the most vulnerable. Especially if they've lost parents, it's a high priority to keep them safe and sheltered. Across Ukraine, the Knights have provided assistance to centers and schools for displaced children.

Clothing the needy

Over 2,000 children received warm coats through the Knights of Columbus Coats for Kids® program — a necessity in Ukraine's frigid winters. In October, K of C Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William Lori visited the town of Bucha, where he helped distribute coats to children who lost parents in the horrific massacres there early in the war.

Bringing the gift of healing

The Knights sponsored an ambulance for the city of Chornomorsk — a crucial resource that allows first responders to quickly aid the wounded. We've also partnered with the International Catholic Migration Commission to create chapels within hospitals and clinics along the war frontlines in south-east Ukraine — quiet havens where people can pray and seek spiritual healing amid the physical trauma of war.

Preserving Ukraine's spiritual heritage

In partnership with Red Arch — and with hope and resolution that the country will rebuild — the Knights of Columbus is proactively safeguarding historic churches across Ukraine.

Ministering to the ministers
