A LENTEN REMINDER





Patriotic Essay Contest

In the past, attempts to get participation from county schools have been futile, while these two schools provide more than 150 entries. Deadline for submission is March 30th and a committee of Sir Knights will select the winning essays with awards to be presented before the end of the school year.

VA Clinic

Each month, members of Assembly 3236 provide a VA Hospitality Table consisting of food, snacks, fruit and drinks at the VA Clinic located near the Eglin west gate for those veterans who need to show up early for fasting blood tests and then have to wait to see a doctor or other healthcare provider. The clinic, like many other facilities, had to implement a number of restrictions because of the COVID epidemic, among which was the prohibition of any volunteers at the clinic. When the Assembly was permitted to return after a two-year hiatus, the sign designed to inform the veterans of the availability of refreshments and the organization responsible was missing.
