The Story of the Annunciation of the Lord April 8, 2024

The feast of the Annunciation, now recognized as a solemnity, was first celebrated in the fourth or fifth century. Its central focus is the Incarnation: God has become one of us. From all eternity God had decided that the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity should become human. Now, as Luke 1:26-38 tells us, the decision is being realized. The God-Man embraces all humanity, indeed all creation, to bring it to God in one great act of love. Because human beings have rejected God, Jesus will accept a life of suffering and an agonizing death: "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends" (John 15:13).

Mary has an important role to play in God's plan. From all eternity, God destined her to be the mother of Jesus and closely related to him in the creation and redemption of the world. We could say that God's decrees of creation and redemption are joined in the decree of Incarnation. Because Mary is God's instrument in the Incarnation, she has a role to play with Jesus in creation and redemption. It is a God-given role. It is God's grace from beginning to end. Mary becomes the eminent figure she is only by God's grace. She is the empty space where God could act. Everything she is she owes to the Trinity.

Mary is the virgin-mother who fulfills Isaiah 7:14 in a way that Isaiah could not have imagined. She is united with her son in carrying out the will of God (Psalm 40:8-9; Hebrews 10:7-9; Luke 1:38).

Together with Jesus, the privileged and graced Mary is the link between heaven and earth. She is the human being who best, after Jesus, exemplifies the possibilities of human existence. She received into her lowliness the infinite love of God. She shows how an ordinary human being can reflect God in the ordinary circumstances of life. She exemplifies what the Church and every member of the Church is meant to become. She is the ultimate product of the creative and redemptive power of God. She manifests what the Incarnation is meant to accomplish for all of us. (franciscanmedia)



Bingo Update



Brother Knights, we will have a new bingo machine for April Bingos (and beyond)!

Our new machine arrived last week of March. Gone is the 30-year-old bingo machine. The new bingo machine still uses balls in a hopper recirculated by a motor and blown up via air through the chute, but with new electronics, output can go through HDMI cable to a monitor. The machine is programmed to play the games our players are all used to, but with new equipment, new and different operation, requires training, and new setup routine. Gone also is the old, large, quite unsightly bingo board. It is being replaced with an 86-inch big screen TV. We now have a perfect opportunity to provide training on how to start up and run bingo. So, if you ever wanted to learn to call Bingo, we have that opportunity. April 14, we will hold a kids bingo at Holy Redeemer. This will be just a laptop, monitor, and a manual ball roller, along with single game sheets and daubers. April 21 starts our string of 4 consecutive months of Sunday bingo. So, we really would like to train some more folks on the machine, cashier, cooks, and can always use the help. Remember bingo supplies ALMOST 95 percent of our charities. It is important and is why CHARITY is the first pillar of a Knight. So, if you can help, please let me know.

And what happens to the old bingo machine and boards (and camera)? Well, we actually have a spare bingo board in the back, a spare camera, and a couple spare parts for the old machine I was able to scavenge off another OLDER machine. We have been approached by our worthy District Deputy about another council may be interested in the machine.






DAILY PRAYER TO END ABORTION
