Saint of the Month:

PASCHAL BAYLON

As a young shepherd, Paschal was so honest that he once offered to give farmers money to repay any harm done when his sheep walked through their crops. Born to a poor Spanish family in 1540, Paschal was put to work as a shepherd at the age of 7. He often prayed when he heard the town church bells ringing during Mass. He worked hard to teach himself to read and, when he could, he read religious books while tending his sheep. He was so holy even as a young man that his friends called him "Blessed Paschal."

He helped support his family with his work until he was 23 years old, when he decided to join the Franciscan order. His superiors wanted him to study to become a priest, but Paschal was so humble he thought he should be a simple brother, working as a cook and gardener and answering the door to visitors.

He spent much of his life in prayer, especially before the Eucharist. Paschal preferred to pray rather than to sleep or eat! When he was not praying, he was helping others, particularly the poor who came to the door of the monastery seeking food or help.

At one point in his life, Paschal was asked to go to France to help spread the Catholic faith. At the time, Catholics were hated in France. Despite the danger, he agreed to go, walking the entire way. When people in France saw his Franciscan clothing, they threw stones at him and beat him. He was even put in prison at one point. Despite this, he would not stop telling people about the Catholic faith.

He returned to Spain in poor health, and died in 1592. In 1690, Paschal was named a saint of the Church.

April in Review

April was the month for the biggest fundraiser of the year – the Golf Tournament! It was also the month for possibly the biggest Service day of the year – Easter Sunday! Both events came off in great fashion and have to be considered great successes. We also celebrated all the Youth Event winners with the entire SJV School!

Easter Sunday: Easter is a day for rejoicing and celebration – and celebrate we did! The Coffee & Donuts crew, led by Eric Rodriguez and including Alan Schlagter, Ray Standard, Joe Clark, Tom Wilhelm, Sean Reedy and others started the day picking up 40 dozen donuts and making Coffee. The Easter Bunny (Ernie Santo) appeared with his helper (Marta Santo) and they were ready for the children before the 7:00 AM Mass ended. It was the start of a long day for everyone.

After the 9:00 PM Mass the Easter Bunny had a whole bunch of kids who went from their bunny encounter to the Easter Egg Hunt led by Jim Valentine and his crew – including Knights, family and Bishop Moore students!

The 40 dozen donuts that we thought would last through the 1:00 PM Mass were actually gone before the 11:00 PM Mass participants got to the Social Hall. Thanks to some contributions of baked goods from the Easter Egg Hunt, we got through that Mass's crowd, but had very little left for the 1:00 PM Mass.

The Easter Bunny stayed for the 1:00 PM Mass crowd and went to the Easter Egg Hunt after that Mass too! The two Easter Egg Hunts had record turnouts – around 90 kids after the 9:00 AM Mass and almost 200 after the 1:00 PM Mass.



SJV School Youth Awards: On April 26th Youth Director Jim Valentine, assisted by Ray Standard, held the presentation of Youth Awards for SJV School. At the end of the school Mass Jim was called to the Cantor stand and he proceeded to present 4 State Championships – 2 in Spelling Bee, and 2 in Basketball Free throw! He then awarded the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place medallions in the Council Competitions for Basketball Free Throw and Soccer, plus awards for the Essay Contest and Poster Contest. All the students seemed to enjoy the event, and they applauded their classmates enthusiastically. This was the culmination of the Council's Youth Program, which included Spelling Bee, Soccer Challenge, Basketball Free throw, Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest and the Essay Contest. Only one presentation yet to go: Altar Server of the year.



Golf Tournament:

On Saturday, April 15 the Council held the Annual Golf McTournament, named in honor of PGK Jack McGivern and PGK Joe McManus. Joe and Vicky Clark, along with a team that included Alan Schlagter, Tom Wilhelm, Jim Jetmore, Sal & Mary Aprile, Ray Standard, Bob Valentine, Leo Silva, Elias DeJesus, Jim Pellichia and others assembled at O-Dark-Thirty at the Remington Golf Course to set up the tournament check-in and decorations. 83 Golfers were signed up, and they were all checked in before 8:00 AM, when they got in their carts and scattered to their first hole assignments.

The day was beautiful, the course was in great shape, lunch was a hit (we actually ran out of food) and everyone had a great time. One of the highlights was the woman who captured the “Closest to the Pin” prize – she was a 96 year old who was golfing with her son and grandson – and yes – she did hit her own shots! We also had Dan Newlin’s Helicopter for the 2nd year, and Aiden from the Bishop Moore Golf Team selling shots that actually went straight and long. Dan donated \$1,000 to the event, and Aiden donated all his proceeds to the Council, despite being urged to take them for the Bishop Moore team.

Many thanks to all the Knights who helped get foursomes to play, hole sponsors and donations. While Joe kept saying he didn’t think it would be close to last year’s total, at last count it was right at \$7,000 income after expenses!!!



Diocese Womens Council Dinner:

Council 5958 was asked to provide dinner for a meeting of the Diocese Women’s Council the night of April 22nd. About 200 people were expected to attend. The request was delivered with short notice, but the Council came through for the Parish in its usual fashion. A dinner of Hot Dogs with Sabretes Onions sauce, Chips, Cole Slaw and beverages was prepared by the team of Eric Rodriguez, Tom Wilhelm, Ray Standard, and Luca & Lyn Ruocco. fingers of a bilateral amputee. None, zero, nada. We have all commented on the shortage of Parish priests, but I’ve not heard much about the lack of religious educators. We should be very concerned.

My 3 sons had nuns and lay teachers at SJVS. Even my grandson had a couple of nuns as he followed his father to SJVS. Now, our students are not exposed to the influence of religious-order educators.

I’d like to share a story: when we moved to Orlando in June, 1982, I went over to SJVS to enroll the 2 oldest of my sons for the 1982/83 school year. I was directed to the Principal’s office and told that she would return in a moment. I remained standing, awaiting her arrival. About 2 minutes later in bustled a 4’10” nun in full habit (Sr. Rita). She didn’t say a word of greeting, but instead went behind her desk, looked at me and said “you may sit”. Something in my brain clicked and I immediately sat down with my feet together, back straight and my hands folded in front of me. I was back in 3rd grade....

Most kids today don’t get the exposure to the disciplines that last a lifetime – such as the one I exhibited without thinking. They learn the basics, but not the levels of self-control and good manners that the nuns drilled into us. I firmly believe that is one of the major failings of our society as a whole. Heck, now a teacher is fired and or sued if she even THINKS about disciplining little Freddie or Sue. SJVS is far better than the alternatives offered in public schools, and the kids are genuinely fun to be with. But they are the exception, and their peers will teach them different behaviors.

I would like to request that you add the following intentions to your daily prayers:

- 1) For Vocations - that God helps our children consider a religious life – as a priest, brother, nun in an order that serves the community
- 2) For our children, that they experience character building mentors as they grow up – whether those mentors are religious or not.

I’m not sure how God will answer our prayers, but my faith tells me He will. I’m not sure where society is headed if He doesn’t.
