Knights Welcome Fr. Saji

We are honored to have our new Parochial Vicar, Reverend Fr. Sajimon Muthirenthikal Chandy, CFIC (He prefers Fr. Saji) join our Council as a 3rd Degree Knight.

Fr. Saji came to St. Joseph's Lakeland from St. Joseph Winter Haven on July 1. Before that Fr. Saji came to the US from southern India where he was ordained in 2000 as a priest of the Sons of the Immaculate Conception. He and his brother priests belong to the Syro-Malabar Rite and are known as St. Thomas Christians, as St. Thomas the Apostle came to India in 52 A.D. and was martyred there some time after.

Father relates that at an early age, he had a strong sense God was calling him to serve. "Even as a child, I had a deep love for the Church and the sacraments. I loved being at Mass, serving as an altar boy and learning about the faith. Though I fully didn't understand it then, I now see that



God was calling me and seeing the dedication and holiness of my parish priests deeply inspired me. I admired their service, their joy and their love for the people."

2025 is Father's Jubilee Year, celebrating his 25th year of ordination on August 11th. Reflecting on his Jubilee Year he said, "My greatest hope for the Church is that it remains a place where people find comfort, healing and a deep relationship with Christ. May it be a source of unity, especially in a time of division, and may its message of compassion, justice and peace spread to all corners of the world."


Exemplification Update

A Note from Our Lecturer - Daniel Wagner

Amnesia and Anamnesis

Today it's easy to believe that we're in the most advanced age in Human History. With tremendous leaps and bounds in science, medicine and technology; the whole human experience can be viewed through a little glass box that's in our pocket. However, does this truly mean we've surpassed our ancestors in enlightenment? In Platonic philosophy, the three big questions asked are: Who am I, Where did I come from, Why am I here? It's paradoxical that we have more information available to us than ever before but find it hard to answer these simple questions. We find ourselves in a state of Amnesia.

Amnesia, Greek for to forget; we forget Who we are, Where we came from, and Why we're here. As Catholics we're fortunate to know the answers to these questions. We are beloved sons and daughters of the Father, who has always known and loved us before space and time were created. We came from God who created us in our mother's womb and has shepherd us through life. We are here to know and to love God as he knows and loves us. These questions are answered for us so frequently, whether its at Mass, or when we read the Scriptures, or by meditating on a specific devotion like the Rosary. But still we constantly loose our focus when the distractions and stress of life cloud our minds.

The solution to our amnesia is another Greek word, Anamnesis. Anamnesis means to have a "profound remembrance". It's the same word used in the Gospel of Luke when Christ is giving his Last Supper instructions to the Apostles, "do this in memory (anamnesis) of me." This profound remembering is given to us by Our Lord to keep us rooted in his love, and to be able to answer the questions previously posed

Now, simply learning a new word still isn't going to prevent all stresses and distractions from creeping into our life. But I would invite you to pray and ask the lord to open the eyes of our hearts and stay rooted in a state of anamnesis. And through constant prayer and discernment we'll begin to see the answers to those questions and stay grounded in God's love for us.
