Living with Eternity in Mind

There is a widespread misconception in our society that a long life is guaranteed. As our beloved Father Buck wisely put it, "nobody is given a piece of paper at birth guaranteeing a certain number of years on this earth." Scripture affirms this truth: our Lord tells us that no one knows the day nor the hour they will be called home. So we must ask—how has this misunderstanding taken hold of our lives? There are several reasons, each revealing how far we've drifted from an eternal perspective.

First, we live in an age where life is too often treated as disposable. Few can articulate why we are here or what it truly means to live. This is evident in the widespread availability of abortion, the growing push for legalized assisted suicide, and the open celebration of death. Second, through social media and other technological advances, we have become desensitized to death. People seem quicker to record than to help, more eager for likes than to save a life, and more accustomed to gossip than to prayer. Finally, we have lost sight of our identity as beings made in the image and likeness of Christ—created for more than worldly success. In our pursuit to become the next great CEO, lawyer, or doctor, we often forget our deeper mission: to become Saints. As Catholic men and Knights of Columbus, we are called to resist this tide—not with despair, but with hope rooted in truth.

Eschatology, the Church's reflection on the "last things," reminds us that every life matters eternally. Death is not the end, but a threshold. Judgment is not condemnation, but clarity. Heaven is not fantasy, but fulfillment. Eschatology invites us to contemplate the Resurrection of Christ, which opens the way for us to spend eternity in communion with God. As 1 Corinthians 16:13 tells us: "Be watchful, stand firm in your faith." By embracing our mortality, we do not become numb to death; rather, we loosen our attachments to this world. This detachment fosters deeper reverence for the sacraments, greater devotion to our Catholic faith, and a sharper focus on our ultimate goal: sainthood.

There are practical steps we can take to live with eternity in mind: daily examination of conscience, praying the Liturgy of the Hours, meditating on *memento mori*, regular reception of the sacraments, and praying for the dead. As Catholic men, we must reject the societal trend of instant gratification and delayed appreciation. As a faith community, let us strive to say an extra thank you, offer an extra hug, hold open another door—even when we don't feel like it. Every suffering the Lord permits is a small death that helps us better understand our mortality, fixing our eyes ever more firmly on Him.

Pins are being distributed to member Knights at our business meeting and at all of our events, including the last business meeting, the recently past Ministry Fair, and the Open House.


Getting a pin for yourself is easy – come to our next business meeting or volunteer to serve at our next Pancake Breakfast.
