#### Canonization of Blessed Michael McGivney Prayer





### Council Fundraising Opportunities – Ken Dauphinais

We held our first Council fundraising meeting on August 7th. It was well attended, and we had some good conversations with regard to current and future fundraising ideas. While our current events, such as the Lenten Fish Fry, State Council's Raffle (details below), and Pancake Breakfast provide our Council's annual operating funds, there is room for other, possibly larger fundraising events, which could be directed toward specific Parish needs or projects. Our next step is to meet with Fr. Zach to gain focus on which projects or needs should be addressed, and how to move forward logistically with raising the necessary funds. *We're always looking for volunteers*, so watch for updates each month as we zero in on events. We'll let you know who to contact, and where to sign up to help.

#### Florida State Council Charity Raffle is Back!

The Florida State Council, Knights of Columbus, is conducting a state-wide raffle in which the proceeds will go to raise funds for local affiliated Councils as well as for Florida K of C Charities, Inc.

Sixty-six raffle books containing 4 raffle tickets each have been distributed directly to our Council. At the Council level, each Knight will be asked to take a number of books and seek donations from their friends and families to buy a chance to win.

The final drawing will be held at the Florida State Council - Annual Convention Dinner, May 23, 2026, in Orlando, Fl. 1st Prize \$25,000 2nd Prize \$5,000 3rd Prizes (2) \$1,000 each

Additionally, our Council will receive a portion of some of the funds collected from the suggested donation of \$3.00 per ticket or \$10 per book.

Here's how it works: The Knight will fill out each ticket with the name and number of the contributor after collecting the donation. The Knight collects the tickets and returns them and the funds directly to Doug Cooper or in a sealed envelope at the Parish Center.

The Council will send in \$6.00 per book distributed while retaining the left over \$4.00. When our Council collects donations for the initial 66 books, we will retain \$264 for our own charitable projects. Should we sell 100 books, we will retain \$400.

In addition to the final drawing, there will be two other drawing for the Knights who are collecting donations: the "Quick Start" and "Early Bird" drawings.

1st prize winning ticket gets \$500.

2nd prize winning ticket gets \$250.

3rd prize winning ticket wins \$100.

### St Michael's Lent - A Summer Period of Reflection

Every Catholic knows that Advent prepares us for Christmas and Lent for Easter. The liturgical calendar is highlighted by these two great opportunities to properly delve into the most important mysteries in the life of Christ. Currently, we are between these seasons and in the thick of Ordinary Time. Sunday, August 31st marks the 22<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time which can become somewhat redundant to many Catholics as they navigate the end of summer and the beginning of the school year. Mother Church, in her brilliance, offers us a unique opportunity to sanctify our hearts in the midst of what seems to be a semi-stagnant time in the liturgical calendar.

Though not officially in the liturgical calendar, St. Michael's Lent is a 40-day spiritual fast that began on the Feast of the Assumption, August 15<sup>th</sup>, and ends on the Feast of St. Michael, September 29<sup>th.\*</sup> Saint Francis, the saint who perhaps embodies the life of Christ more than any other, started this devotion as he deeply venerated St. Michael the Archangel as a protector of souls. Legend states that St. Francis also received the stigmata during this period of penance and fasting.

Why begin on the Assumption? Mary is the Queen of Heaven, assumed body and soul into the realm of the angels. The culmination on Michaelmas thus allows us to develop a connection to the power of the angelic hierarchies in our lives: Michael fights, Mary crushes.

Through this supplemental Lenten period, tradition offers us an organic way to develop relationships with the three archangels found in Scripture (Raphael, Gabriel, and Michael) and our own guardian angel. Have you ever prayed through the intercession of your guardian angel --asked him his name? The Franciscan tradition encourages us to ask these beautiful questions of our heart.

Fellow brother knights Daniel Wagner, Clay Tucker, Akol Arop, Manny Velazquez, Steve Simeone, and I have found that this period of devotion has strengthened our hearts' understanding of seeing Christ in all things and developing relationships with our angelic protectors.



How do you participate? Pray daily the litany of St. Michael (which can be found online), implement a daily or weekly act of penance, demonstrate charity through the corporal works of mercy, and attempt a weekly Confession and/or additional Mass during the week.

I encourage all of our brother Knights to use this time as a novel way to come closer into the tradition of the Church so that we may become saints with our Lord in eternity.

#### "FAITH WITHOUT WORKS"

One of the most misunderstood differences between ourselves and some of our Protestant brethren is the subject of ""faith and works". Many say "just have faith, believe in the Lord Jesus Christ and you will be saved." But Jesus did say, "Not everyone who cries "Lord, Lord" shall enter the kingdom of heaven but only he who does the will of my Father."

Briefly - all the good works in the world would not "earn" anyone the right to heaven. If it weren't for the Cross it would be impossible. So, we can't totally "earn" our way into heaven by our good deeds. On the other hand - we must listen to Jesus for the clues -- He did not say that some souls would be lost. Now, if He died for all, how come some would be lost?

Learn - in addition to what He did, He asks us to join Him in doing the will of the Father. In other words, our acts *MUST* reveal and give **support to our faith** and not simply rely on a statement of what we believe. Words can be cheap.

This is one of the most important understandings we need in the practice of our faith. It is also part of the foundation for our belonging to the Knights of Columbus. We not only **BELIEVE** it is a good Catholic organization, but we support and back up that belief by our participation in its works.

There are a few in our Council who physically or for other valid reasons just can't help with Lenten Fish Fry Events, Tootsie Roll Drives, Pancake Breakfasts, painting of our parish hall or other events; but they could be part of a "phone tree", attending Council meetings or other activities that may not require physical strength. Each of us, as Council members need to be involved in some way in Council activities.
