

ALL SAINTS & ALL SOULS MONTH - All Saints and All Souls comprise the two-day celebration of the Communion of Saints – those who are with God in heaven and those who are on their way to heaven. On the Solemnity of All Saints, November 1st, the Church celebrates those Christians who achieved spiritual excellence. It is a day to venerate all the holy men and women who have been canonized by the Church. A day later, on the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day), the Church remembers and prays for the faithful departed: our brothers and sisters who have died marked with the sign of faith. Particularly, we pray for all the souls in purgatory.

A HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION - In the US and many other countries, All Saints Day is a Holy Day of Obligation and a day not just for remembering the saints, but for honoring and paying respects to our departed loved ones, usually with prayers, flowers, and good offerings.

What an awesome gift to know that we play a role by our presence in saving the life of a baby and possibly softening the hardened heart of PP clients and their family.

We are always joined by a wonderful group from St. Paul's RC Church in Arcadia, who are there every Thursday and are an inspiration to us by their prayerful witness.

A DAY OF SPIRITUAL REFLECTION

MARK YOUR CALENDAR. On Saturday, November 18th, St. Thomas More Council 7826 will host a day of Spiritual Reflection. The session will be held in the Chelsea Center.
