Grand Knights Report

You might not think there is a connection between our celebration of Labor Day and Blessed Father McGivney as illustrated on the cover of our newsletter... but there is. Labor Day pays tribute to the contributions and achievements of American workers. It was created by the labor movement in the late 19th century and became a federal holiday in 1894. It is fitting that we recall the history of our Order and the motivation of our Founder, Blessed Michael J McGivney during this Chapter in American worker history.

In the late 1800s, at the height of the Industrial Revolution in the United States, the average American worked 12-hour days and seven-day weeks in order to eke out a basic living. Despite restrictions in some states, children as young as 5 or 6 toiled in mills, factories and mines across the country, earning a fraction of their adult counterparts' wages. People of all ages, particularly the very poor and recent immigrants, often faced extremely unsafe working conditions, with insufficient access to fresh air, sanitary facilities and work breaks.

It was during this tumultuous time that an American Catholic priest, Fr. Michael J. McGivney, founded the Knights Columbus at St. Mary's Church in 1882 as a mutual benefit society for Catholic immigrants in New Haven, Connecticut. As a parish priest in an immigrant community, McGivney saw what could happen to a family when the main income earner died. This was before most government support programs were established. Because of religious and ethnic discrimination, Catholics in the late 19th century were regularly excluded from labor unions, popular fraternal organizations, and other organized groups that provided such social services.

Thanks to the foresight of our Founder, Blessed Michael J. McGivney, to address the conditions within his local community and his determination to help those widows and orphans, the Knights of Columbus started during the labor movement in the late 19th century. It has grown to become an international organization with over 2 million members dedicated to Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism.

These core principles are implemented through charitable gift-giving and a comprehensive financial and insurance program for its members. As we celebrate Labor Day let us recall the courage of Fr. McGivney this Labor Day and renew our commitment to works of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity for those in need.

Thank you for asking me to be your Chaplain. All throughout my years in seminary I have been blessed to have the knights support me through both their prayers and their financial support and I cannot tell you how much that meant to me. It was such a powerful witness that someone who did not even know me would support me over and over again. You have helped so many seminarians to the priesthood and the Church cannot thank you enough for all that you have done for us. I haven't shared this with many but one of the reasons I looked forward to being ordained was so that I can finally serve the knights in return for all that they have done for me.

At all the parishes I've served at as a seminarian, the Knights of Columbus have always been the heart of the community. One only needs to look at your Knights calendar to see how active and important you are to the life of the parish. Thank you for all the work you do, for all the many ways you serve St. Thomas More, and for being true witnesses of His love and service. Know that as your Chaplain I hope to serve you as best I can. Be assured of my prayers for each of you and your families and thank you once again for being so good and welcoming to me.

NEWS FROM OUR FRATERNAL BENEFITS ADVISOR

He left the seminary to work and support his mother and siblings. As a pastor, he didn't want other Catholic families to find themselves in such a predicament. That, and uniting men of faith, was the impetus for establishing our Order. Everyone who joined in those first years was insured; that was part and parcel of being in the organization. Now every member has a choice. I'd like every member to know what we do, and how we do it. Here's the process I use when I meet with families:

- 1.Discover Identify their current insurance situation and financial goals
