#### A Ceremony of Patriotism and Purpose: Bishop Charles McLaughlin Assembly 1818 Inducts New Officers





#### **Guardians of the Rose-The Silver Rose Pilgrimage**

The Silver Rose Program is one of the most cherished traditions within the Knights of Columbus, symbolizing unity, devotion to Our Lady of Guadalupe, and a commitment to the sanctity of life. Every year, eight Silver Roses journey from Canada through the U.S. to Mexico, ending at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City on December 12th, the Feast of Our Lady.

Florida Knights on Bikes plays a vital role in escorting the Silver Rose during its pilgrimage. Whether riding across Florida

highways or standing in solemn prayer, they ensure that the message of **One Life, One Rose** reaches every corner of the community.
