Chaplain's Inspiration:

Pope Francis approved of the first miracle attributed to Father McGivney on May 27, 2020. This action by our Holy Father means that we can refer to our founder as **"Blessed" Michael McGivney".** This step is just prior to sainthood. <u>One more miracle</u> will be required for his canonization as a saint.

The miracle recognized as coming through Father McGivney's intercession involved an unborn child in the United States. In 2015, this child was healed in-utero of a life-threatening condition after prayers by his family to Father McGivney.

Father McGivney spent his entire priesthood in parish ministry and died of pneumonia on August 14, 1890— two days after his 38th birthday – after falling ill amid a pandemic. Recent scientific evidence indicates that that pandemic – like the current one – may have been caused by a **coronavirus**.

A date will soon be set for the beatification Mass, which will take place in Connecticut. It will include the reading of an apostolic letter from the Holy Father and the bestowing of the title "Blessed" on Father McGivney.

Earlier this year, in an address to the Knights of Columbus Board of Directors, Pope Francis said the organization has been faithful "to the vision of your founder, Venerable Michael McGivney, who was inspired by the principles of Christian charity and fraternity to assist those most in need."

My good brother Knights, as your chaplain, I could not be **prouder** of the many ways you have brought the vision of our founder to reality. You are touching the lives of so many of our parishioners and beyond. The greatest mark of our brotherhood is **charity**. You are exemplars and witnesses to the beautiful spirit of Blessed McGivney. I am honored to be a part of your order here at Blessed Sacrament Parish. May all the men of our parish reap the benefits of your good hearts.
